

ITC COURSE ROTATION

Day Courses

In order to assure availability of all courses to all students—days, nights, and weekends; and to ensure that no one day is overloaded with courses, the faculty of ITC approved the following course rotation schedule in 2006. The Blocks A to F show the course rotation for day courses.

The first column represents Tuesday classes; the second, Wednesday courses; the third, Thursday courses. The first row represents 8 a.m. classes; the second, 1:20 p.m. classes. Courses available for each block are listed below the charts.

Course Rotation: Night and Weekend Courses
From Fall 2010 onwards

In order to assure availability of all courses to all students—days, nights, and weekends; and to ensure that no one day is overloaded with courses, the faculty of ITC approved the following course rotation schedule. On this page is the rotation for night courses.

The first four columns represent Tuesday through Friday evenings. Columns five and six represent Saturday morning and afternoon courses.

Courses were scheduled in J-L to accommodate the distance education students when we offered mainly synchronous courses. It is possible that, after the second full rotation, evening courses may be readjusted to rotate in the same manner as day courses.

The evening schedule presumes that students will take 12 credit hours per semester and thus will graduate in four years.
